CD ▶ 01

Until recently, hospitals and medical centers were the largest and most organized of healthcare agencies. Because of rising costs, more procedures and treatments are being performed on an ambulatory basis. Clients come to an ambulatory care facility and usually do not stay overnight. A hallmark of good ambulatory care is through family and client education. The role of nurses in an ambulatory center can vary considerably, depending on their education and the center's management.

Community healthcare agencies offer care to a neighborhood or community. Many care facilities, such as day care centers and ambulatory care centers, also are community based. Many have come into existence as a result of federal legislation. Because hospital stays are shorter, care provided in the community has expanded. The following stories illustrate how this shift has influenced nursing practice.

CD ▶ 07

After graduation from a BSN program, Liz worked on telemetry, medical, and pediatrics units in a large hospital. She went on to graduate school and worked as a nurse specialist in transfusion services. She was responsible for reviewing and analyzing blood counts and ordering blood, platelets, and other blood products. Liz earned her master's degree in 1996, having completed research on health education for preschool children. After the birth of her third child, Liz decided that she would like to be home more during the day and work during the evenings.

CD ▶ 08

Her job search took her down many paths. She finally decided that she could best use her clinical experience and graduate education by working with a consulting nurse services unit. Such units have increased dramatically with the shift to community-based nursing. In her current position, Liz works 6 to 8 hours a day, answering questions from callers in the community. Examples of calls that Liz receives include, "My doctor told me that I will be having a CT-guided rib biopsy; what does that mean, and what might they be looking for with this test?" "On TV, I saw the E.coli warnings on cold cereal; what should we do?" The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the local health department work in conjunction with the staff to keep employees informed about public health issues and concerns. Staff then provide relevant information to callers who express interest in such topical health concerns.

CD ▶ 09

Liz's county is currently exploring options to improve use of emergency medical services (EMS) in conjunction with such consulting services. The study's results may allow more efficient use of staff and resources and increased customer satisfaction. Many people who call 911 may require only a verbal discussion with a nurse to adequately address their healthcare concerns. Consulting nurses may be able to triage specific calls, or prioritize them in order of importance.

For example, flu, minor injuries, and stuffy noses would be handled after life-threatening or traumatic experiences.

CD ▶ 10

Liz's work illustrates how public policy and procedure evolve with economic concerns, the public's needs, and the resources available to a community. Liz states, "This work exemplifies what nurses do best: education, evaluation, personal reassurance, and community-accessed and -integrated care—people in their own homes calling and attempting to understand how best they can meet their needs in the real-life situation."

nurse specialist: 専門看護師の資格には様々なものがあるが、中核は臨床専門看護師 (CNS=Certified Nurse Specialist) である. CNS の資格を取るには十分な経験と知識が要求され、以前は看護学士 (BSN) でも取れたがいまでは看護学修士 (MSN) が必須である. 各分野でそれぞれの協会があって、たとえば手術室などで大きな役割を果たす輸血看護の分野では、アメリカ輸血専門看護師協会 (American Association of Transfusion Nurse Specialists) がある.

consulting nurse services: たとえばワシントン州のシアトル市にある保険医療協同組合(Group Health Cooperatives) にもコンサルティングナースサービスという部門があって、コンサルティングの専門看護師が24時間体制で市民の健康相談に対応し、病院の紹介や救急車の手配なども行っている。またここでは新しい試みとして消防署の救急本部と連携し、救急電話911でも救命依頼ならば、ここの専門看護師が出て triage(優先度の判定)を行い、救急車の必要があればすぐに指示を出し、またその必要がなければ応急処置の指示など別な方法で患者の支援をしている。
